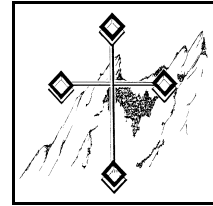

A Letter from the Pastor

Greetings in the name of Christ!

Recently, I was exiting a grocery store in the area when the individual next to me complained quite loudly about winter. Sure, it was a slushy day. Sure, it could have been nicer. But her complaint was just about the opposite of how I was encountering the weather. It is still a fresh memory for me that in Texas, winter, spring, summer, and fall were often very seamless. At the same time she was complaining, I was standing next to her thinking "This is great!"

With mixed emotions I know that Lent signals that spring is on its way. It will not be too long before snow shovels and heavy winter coats will be exchanged for shorts, t-shirts, and lawn mowers. You see, I am still grateful for the change in seasons and I can't wait to get back into the yard and try some of the different techniques for lawn care I have read about during this winter season.

Aside from being a sign of spring, Lent is also a great time to adopt a new spiritual discipline. Many at Mount Calvary have picked up their wooden cedar cross and committed to praying before they leave and upon their return home. Some are even gathering as a family once a day for prayer around the cross.

If you haven't yet picked up your cross, please come by the church office. Each is a beautiful creation of Bill Renfer's. We thank him for his skill and loving craftsmanship. If you choose to decorate your cross as a part of your Lenten journey, I would sure love to see them. Please send me a digital picture or drop by and show it to us. On the first Sunday of Lent, the children's sermon focused on the way we collect lint in our pockets and that occasionally we need to take time to clean it out. It is an interesting image to work with in the church. Every so often, we need to make time to review and refresh various aspects of our ministry. During this lent, I am asking Jenny Evarts and others to come together as a team to review our Sunday school curriculum. The purpose of this review is to carefully consider if we are providing the best in Christian education we possibly can. This Lenten season will allow us the time we need to consider what is working well in education and how we might improve our educational offerings. Please LOOK for opportunities to help with this process! We will need input from many different perspectives. Announcements will likely come through the bulletin and future *Parish Visitor* articles.

Another adjustment that we are going to implement at the conclusion of the Lenten season involves confirmation studies. On April 1, we will gather our confirmation students as well as restart "Families in Faith." If you are looking for a way to be involved, this is another great chance. Please let me know if you have any ideas about how this night at MCLC can be meaningful and fit into your busy schedules.

Finally, if you haven't had a chance yet to meet our youth ministry interim associate, Amanda Mayhew, she is a marvelous addition to our staff. Her energy and enthusiasm for helping kids make a connection to Christ is contagious! I have yet to witness her meeting a stranger. Call the office or stop in to meet her. It will be worth the effort.

The writer of Ecclesiastes said that for everything there is a season. I feel that, with the solid financial conclusion to 2007 and stepping boldly into our ministry plan for 2008, Mount Calvary's long winter is ending. Just like the flowers will soon be bursting forth, we know that new life is already taking hold. I sense excitement building!

Finally, take time for God. Many of you know I am the consummate list-maker, and I am phenomenally well-organized, juggling a myriad of events locally, regionally, and nationally. Sometimes that list can turn into our own personal golden calf. Light a candle or switch on that fireplace in the living room, turn on a CD of sacred music—Pergolesi, Vivaldi, or quiet Mozart. Pray...and most of all...listen. After long fourteen-hour days, I pull into the driveway in Longmont late in the evening, and I am dazzled by the vast array of brilliant stars overhead. I hear the wind, feel the snow, and experience the silence.

It is there God's Spirit whispers and embraces.

Flatirons Habitat for Humanity Gets Thrivent Builds Grant!

In year three of the Thrivent Build program that will fund \$125,000,000 toward building HFH homes, Flatirons HFH wins a grant! The grant means that Thrivent will be providing 70 percent of the cost of the home! With this grant come some requirements and goals for Lutherans in the Flatirons community. As a community we need to raise 10 percent of the cost—this can include money or in-kind donations (materials, skilled labor, etc.). Also, the goal is to have 50 percent of the labor come from Lutherans (including friends and family). Thrivent Builds has already built hundreds of homes around the country and the goals are being met by the generosity of Lutherans all over the United States. You can be a part of this exciting program to help people get into affordable housing.

The Flatirons HFH has set aside many days that Lutherans can join the volunteer workers and future homeowners to build their new home. NEWS FROM OUR INTERN

Cold Greetings to the Snowy Rockies!

Well, I must admit that the characteristics of the church seasons are certainly felt in Alaska. Nick and I survived the darkest part of the year, right before Christmas. We began the season of Epiphany in dark, with more light coming in each day. It was strange to wake up in the dark and not have light until about lunch time. The only sun we saw for a few weeks was the orange on the horizon. Then by 3:00 p.m., it was dark again. We certainly appreciated the light shining a little more each day. I realized just how much I depend on the light. I knew that from growing up in the sunniest state, Colorado. But I did not realize just how much I needed the light in January. I certainly reflected on how much I take Christ's light for granted as well. It is a humbling reality to not realize what you are missing until you do not have it!

The one joy with the darkness was the beautiful Aurora borealis, wow! I have seen them

dazzle above the trees, revealing a mysterious dancing light. We have it dazzling on our banners for Lent, revealing the mystery of the light of God in these reflective times of Lent. Just as Epiphany ended, we received another surprise—very, very cold temperatures. It began at -24 degrees, but as I write this on the day after Ash Wednesday, it has dipped to -50 degrees. It is the coldest it has been since 2000. Nick wanted to endure some harsh Alaska temperatures, so the congregation is blaming these cold days on him.

We started the Lenten season in the bitter cold, so cold that a few churches even cancelled services. I preached and so had no choice but to experience the Alaska that makes one tough, or so they say. It makes my car tough—that is for sure. I realize in this Lenten season that I cannot depend on myself; I would freeze to death. Especially in these dangerously cold times, people check in on one another. Nick is out of town training for a probation officer job. He is near Anchorage, leaving me alone. So people have checked in on me several times, to make sure my car is working, that my furnace is producing heat, and that I am well fed. They are also checking in on one another and reporting back to the church. It feels good to have a caring community during these times. Some members' furnaces went out, others' pipes froze, and still others couldn't start their cars. They were all taken care of by members, thanks be to God. We are blessed to have people who can help in times of need. We are reminded that we can't make it without one another and God. Again, it is very humbling.
